We're on the hunt for a brand-new member of the Broken Spoke team, could it be you? Broken Spoke is a community benefit society and social enterprise dedicated to supporting everyone in Oxford to fix and ride their cycles. An important part of this is our wonderful community workshop, a bikey haven hidden away in St Thomas's, in Oxford, from where everything we do is based. We're looking for a community-focussed, learning-enabling, active-travel enthusiast to join our small but mighty team as a Community Coordinator.

Working alongside a mixture of cycling instructors, mechanics and our trusty volunteers, you'll be part of the staff team responsible for making the organisation a wonderful place to be, for everyone. The job is centred on supporting and strengthening the communities at Broken Spoke. With support from other members of the staff team, you'll be supporting the day-to-day running of Broken Spoke's activities through stock-taking, coordinating volunteers, communicating with the outside world, and monitoring cycle training bookings. You'll also be responsible for bringing new folks into the workshop, including those who don't normally spend time in bikey spaces, and you'll play an important role in making everyone feel welcomed and valued.

Broken Spoke is run on the co-operative principles - an important factor in what it means to work with us. From the beginning you'll be 'peer managed' by another member of the staff team and encouraged to get involved in the operations and governance of the co-op. Our roles and responsibilities are varied and flexible, and through regularly looking at who does what, we explore how to make it easier to work with all aspects of the organisation.

In our workshop and across Oxford, we equip people with the skills and support they need to build, maintain and ride their own cycles. We feel the same about supporting our people to build their careers, and the right person for Broken Spoke will be someone who is intrigued to also build skills as a cycle mechanic, cycling instructor, and community advocate for cycling in Oxfordshire.

Essential Skills - What skills will I bring and how will I use them?

- Are you a clear communicator? You'll be responsible for our communications, internal
 and external. We need someone who is enthusiastic with social media, email
 communications and internal communications with our volunteers and staff.
- Are you a skilled community organiser? Our volunteers, casual staff and regular
 customers are the wheels that keep us turning. You'll be responsible for coordinating our
 volunteers, and getting your teeth into developing volunteer engagement in a way that
 supports people in feeling valued and loved. This will include maintaining rotas, arranging
 open meetings & events, and sharing regular updates.
- Are you a systems whizz? You'll be responsible for maintaining the booking & reporting systems for our cycle training. Working alongside others who will help you learn, you'll contribute to maintaining the workshop's stock levels of parts and tools. So we need someone who is diligent with this kind of work.
- Are you a team player? We are a small and committed team, and we're looking for someone with experience of working cooperatively with others, who is keen to get their hands dirty with helping us try to change the world.
- Are you a people person? Much of the role is public facing, liaising with volunteers and customers. We need someone who enjoys this and is happy to answer questions and help people to feel at home.

Desirable Skills - What other skills might be helpful and why?

- Do you like understanding how things work? Do you enjoy working on projects and solving puzzles? Do you like to share what you know with others in an accessible and empowering way? Our educational programmes focus on hands-off teaching and learning by doing. We'd love for you to get involved in this aspect of our work, and whether by formal training or by picking things up as you go along, skills development can lead to unexpected things!
- Are you as passionate as us about diversity and inclusion? Let's face it, cycling can get a bit male, pale & stale... Broken Spoke has a proud history of being founded and run by people of different genders, and we're always striving to make our workshop a welcoming place for many folks who don't normally feel comfortable in a workshop environment. Examples of how we're already doing this include our popular Beryl's Night and our workshop's safer spaces policy. We know there's lots more to be done and we hope you're keen to play a role in this.
- Are you interested in writing grant applications? Broken Spoke's income comes from a
 number of sources, including some of it from grants. In this role you'll be invited to feed into
 bid writing and fundraising efforts so if you've got any experience in fundraising, we want to
 hear about it!

Training - How will I know what to do?

We'll provide training on all of Broken Spoke's existing systems and processes. Also, subject to external funding, you could train to be a level 2 cycle mechanic or national standard cycling instructor.
